### 1. ABOUT PSU PATTANI CAMPUS

Prince of Songkla University (PSU) Pattani Campus, located in southern Thailand, is part of the larger PSU network, which is renowned for being one of Thailand's leading institutions in education, research, and regional development. Established in 1967, PSU was named in honor of the father of King Bhumibol Adulyadej (King Rama IX) and serves as a premier institution dedicated to improving educational access and quality in southern Thailand.

Prince of Songkla University (PSU) began its educational journey on the Pattani Campus, which stands as the university's first campus. Founded in 1966 in Ruesamilae, Mueang District, Pattani Province, PSU Pattani is recognized as the first and largest university in Thailand's southern region, dedicated to advancing education, research, and community engagement.

Originally named "The University of Southern Thailand" in September 1967, the institution was renamed "Prince of Songkla University" by His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej (King Rama IX) on March 12, 1968, a date now observed as the university's official establishment day. PSU Pattani is primarily known for its focus on arts and social sciences, conducting research and academic services that nurture and develop fields such as language, culture, social science, humanities, and fine arts. March 13 is celebrated as PSU's founding day, honoring its legacy in the southern region and its role as a cornerstone of education and cultural development.

There are eight faculties at Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus: 1) Faculty of Education 2) Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences 3) Faculty of Science and Technology 4) Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts 5) Faculty of Communication Sciences 5) Faculty of Political Science 7) Faculty of Nursing, Pattani Campus 8) Faculty of Islamic Sciences

### 2. INTRODUCTION

The PSU Pattani Campus is pleased to continue hosting its Student Mobility Program for international students in 2025, building on the successful implementation of the initiative in 2023 and 2024. The program was first launched in the first semester of 2023 and has since been organized annually as part of PSU's commitment to fostering an internationalized

academic environment. In alignment with the University's vision, the program aims to cultivate global citizenship and enhance cross-cultural understanding among students.

The program primarily engages partner universities under existing Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), particularly from Southeast Asia, with more than 30 universities invited to participate. Exchange students who complete the program are awarded an academic transcript and a certificate of participation; however, no academic degree is conferred by PSU. The main participants are students from universities across Southeast Asia, and the program's key objectives are to promote an international atmosphere on campus and encourage multicultural living.

In addition, the program seeks to enhance students' English language proficiency while providing meaningful exposure to Thai culture. Participants take part in various academic and cultural activities that introduce them to Thai cuisine, tourism, fashion, and local traditions, thereby enriching their overall cross-cultural experience and strengthening intercultural competence.

Notably, in 2025, the program welcomed students from Indonesia for the first time. This cohort included 8 students from Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin (UniSZA), Malaysia, 4 students from Universitas Padjadjaran (UNPAD), Indonesia and 1 student from Universitas Udayana (UDAYANA), Indonesia marking an important milestone in the expansion of the program's regional engagement.

### **3. OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of the Student Mobility Program are as follows:

1. **Fostering a Global Campus Atmosphere:** The program offers students the opportunity to experience a new academic and cultural environment at a university in Thailand, enriching their perspectives and broadening their global outlook.
2. **Providing a Multicultural Learning Environment:** By participating in this exchange, students gain a deeper understanding of cultural diversity, allowing them to appreciate and navigate multicultural differences.
3. **Enhancing English Language Proficiency:** Interaction with international students provides local students valuable opportunities to improve their English, particularly in listening and speaking, through real-life conversations and cultural exchanges.

### 11. ACTIVITY

#### 11.1 Pick-Up the Students and Dormitory Check-In

In early June, Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, organized the arrival and reception of international students participating in the Student Mobility Program 2025. Students from Universitas Padjadjaran (UNPAD) and Universitas Udayana, Indonesia, were picked up from Hat Yai International Airport, while students from Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin (UniSZA), Malaysia, arrived via the Sungai Kolok border. All students were assisted with transportation and completed dormitory check-in on the same day of arrival to ensure a smooth transition into campus life. Female students (8 persons) were accommodated at Dormitory 8, while male students (5 persons) were assigned to Dormitory 9. The successful coordination demonstrated PSU Pattani's strong commitment to student care, safety, and effective international student management.



## 11.2 Universitas Udayana Student Joins Jacaranda Blue Blossom

On 21 June 2025, Mr. Yehezkiel Agustinus Mauliku, an exchange student from Universitas Udayana, Indonesia, joined the Jacaranda Blue Blossom morning walk at Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus. The event brought together more than 2,000 students, staff, alumni, and community members to explore Pattani's cultural, historical, and spiritual heritage through two learning routes, reflecting PSU Pattani's strong commitment to intercultural understanding, unity in diversity, and global citizenship.



### 11.3 Orientation

On 25 June 2025, Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, held an orientation program at the Office of the President to welcome 13 international students from Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin (Malaysia), Universitas Padjadjaran, and Universitas Udayana (Indonesia) who were participating in the Student Mobility Program 2025. Now in its third year, the program aims to support students' academic adjustment while promoting intercultural exchange and internationalization at PSU Pattani. The orientation was attended by PSU executives, course lecturers, and relevant staff, who provided essential information on academic arrangements, student services, campus facilities, and cultural adaptation. The session also offered an opportunity for students to engage with university representatives, helping them prepare for their academic journey and daily life at PSU Pattani.



### 11.4 Pattani Signature Dish Festival

As part of the cultural immersion activities under the Student Mobility Program, students participated in the “Pattani Signature Dish Festival,” held on 4 July at the Art and Cultural Square in front of Pattani City Hall. The event aimed to promote Pattani’s local culinary heritage and cultural identity through a variety of traditional food exhibitions, community booths, and cultural showcases. During the festival, students had the opportunity to experience local gastronomy, interact with community members and local vendors, and observe cultural practices that reflect the multicultural character of Pattani Province. The activity enhanced students’ understanding of local ways of life while encouraging cross-cultural learning, social interaction, and community engagement. Participation in the festival also supported experiential learning beyond the classroom and strengthened the connection between international students and the local community.



## 11.5 Welcome Back Event

Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, hosted the “International Students: Welcome Back Event” on 30 June 2025 to warmly welcome returning international students and reaffirm the university’s commitment to a multicultural and inclusive learning environment. Students from the Student Mobility Program (SMP) also joined the event. The event was attended by PSU executives and relevant staff, who extended their warm welcome and shared words of encouragement with the students. The gathering provided an opportunity for interaction between international students and the university community, helping to strengthen mutual understanding and foster a supportive campus atmosphere.



### 11.6 English World Café Program

On 9 July 2025, students from the Student Mobility Program (SMP) participated in the English World Café Program, an interactive activity aimed at enhancing English communication skills in a relaxed and supportive environment. Through small-group discussions and interactive tasks, students practiced real-life English communication while building confidence. The program was facilitated by lecturers from the Faculty of Education, Faculty of Islamic Sciences, and Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, who guided discussions and supported student engagement. The activity promoted active learning and cross-cultural exchange, contributing to students' language development and intercultural understanding at PSU Pattani.



### 11.7 International Day: Together for Tomorrow – SDGs Fusion Fest at PSU Pattani

SMP students participated in International Day: Together for Tomorrow – SDGs Fusion Fest, organized by Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, on 27 August 2025 at the Phra Piboon Pittayapark Residence. The event attracted over 500 participants from Thailand and abroad, including students, faculty members, consular representatives, and partner institutions. The opening ceremony was presided over by Ms. Pateemoh Sadeeyamu, Governor of Pattani Province, with welcome remarks from Asst. Prof. Dr. Attachai Ueranantasun, Vice President for Pattani Campus, and a report by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Montira Leelakriangsak, Vice President for Academic Affairs. Distinguished guests included the Consuls of Malaysia and Indonesia, representatives from Adamson University (Philippines), Universiti Malaya (Malaysia), and the RENPER network.



### 11.8 Khon Performance in Honor of the King

On 9 September 2025, students from the Student Mobility Program (SMP) joined the Khon masked dance performance held to honor His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej the Great on the occasion of his birthday anniversary. The event, organized at Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, showcased Thailand's rich cultural heritage and provided international students with a valuable opportunity to experience traditional Thai performing arts and royal cultural traditions.



### 11.9 PSU Open House 2025

SMP students took part in PSU Open House 2025 on 3 September 2025, joining a variety of activities designed to introduce academic programs, campus life, and student services at Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus. The event provided an opportunity for students to engage with faculty members, explore academic offerings, and gain insight into learning environments and extracurricular activities. Through exhibitions, interactive sessions, and campus tours, the program promoted educational awareness, cultural exchange, and a welcoming atmosphere for prospective and international students alike.



### 11.10 Songkhla Trip

SMP students joined a field trip to Hat Yai District, Songkhla Province, organized under the Student Mobility Program 2025. The activity aimed to enhance cultural learning by introducing students to local lifestyles, cultural landmarks, and community spaces in the area. Throughout the trip, students had opportunities to engage with the local community, experience cultural diversity, and participate in shared activities that encouraged interaction and mutual understanding between Thai and international students. The program also helped strengthen friendships, promote intercultural communication, and enrich students' overall learning experience beyond the classroom.



### 11.11 Phatthalung Trip

SMP students joined a field trip outing at Koh Kla Ton Phra Thong Camping, located in Kongraja District, Phatthalung Province, as part of experiential learning and cultural enrichment activities. The trip aimed to provide students with real-world learning experiences beyond the classroom through outdoor and adventure-based activities that encouraged teamwork, communication, and leadership skills. During the outing, students participated in ATV activities and visited a local waterfall, allowing them to explore the natural landscape while enjoying recreational experiences in a safe and supervised environment. These activities helped foster environmental awareness, social interaction, and cross-cultural understanding. The field trip enhanced students' overall learning experience and reflected the program's commitment to holistic education and active, experiential learning.



### 11.12 Farewell Party

On 9 October 2025, at 1:30 p.m., Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, through the Corporate Communication and Global Affairs Center, organized the Farewell Ceremony for the Student Mobility Program 2025. The event featured certificate presentations and closing remarks, aiming to strengthen friendship networks and academic cooperation within the ASEAN region. The Student Mobility Program has been continuously organized during the first semester of the academic years 2023, 2024, and 2025, providing international students with opportunities to learn and exchange experiences with Thai students. The program supports PSU Pattani's commitment to internationalization and the promotion of a multicultural learning environment on campus.



### 11.13 Repatriate Students

Prince of Songkla University, Pattani Campus, organized the repatriation of students under the Student Mobility Program 2025, with arrangements divided into three periods based on partner universities. Students from Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin (UniSZA) returned on 10 October 2025 via the Sungai Kolok Border, while students from Universitas Udayana returned on the same day via Hat Yai International Airport. Students from Universitas Padjadjaran (UNPAD) were repatriated on 15 October 2025, also via Hat Yai International Airport. All students returned home safely, reflecting PSU Pattani's commitment to student welfare and effective international program management.



## 12. PSU STUDENT MOBILITY PROGRAM 2025 SATISFACTION SURVEY

### 11.1 Overview of Participant Demographics

The PSU Student Mobility Program 2025 involved a total of 13 participants, all of whom were students. The cohort was comprised of individuals from two neighboring Southeast Asian countries: Malaysia, representing the majority with 8 students (61.5%), and Indonesia, with 5 students (38.5%).

In terms of gender distribution, the program saw a higher representation of female students, who accounted for 61.5% of the group (8 students), while male students made up the remaining 38.5% (5 students).

### 11.2 Analysis of Student Satisfaction: PSU Student Mobility Program 2025

Based on the survey data from the PSU Student Mobility Program 2025, here is the conclusion of the satisfaction results for all questions, including the **Mean** and **Standard Deviation (SD)**. *Satisfaction Survey Results (N=13)*

### 11.3 Summary Conclusion

- Highest Satisfaction: The items related to cultural exchange, instructor helpfulness, coordinator services, recommendations, and personal expectations all received the highest average score of 4.92.
- Lowest Satisfaction: While still positive, the PSU dormitory comfort had the lowest mean score (4.31) and the highest variability ( $SD = 0.95$ ), suggesting that experiences with the accommodation were the most diverse among participants.
- Overall Recommendation: With a mean of 4.92 for recommending the program, it is clear that the participants were highly satisfied with their experience.
