1. ABOUT PSU PATTANI CAMPUS

Prince of Songkla University (PSU) Pattani Campus, located in southern Thailand, is part of the larger PSU network, which is renowned for being one of Thailand[,] s leading institutions in education, research, and regional development. Established in 1967, PSU was named in honor of the father of King Bhumibol Adulyadej (King Rama IX) and serves as a premier institution dedicated to improving educational access and quality in southern Thailand.

Prince of Songkla University (PSU) began its educational journey on the Pattani Campus, which stands as the university's first campus. Founded in 1966 in Ruesamilae, Mueang District, Pattani Province, PSU Pattani is recognized as the first and largest university in Thailand's southern region, dedicated to advancing education, research, and community engagement.

Originally named "The University of Southern Thailand" in September 1967, the institution was renamed "Prince of Songkla University" by His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej (King Rama IX) on March 12, 1968, a date now observed as the university's official establishment day. PSU Pattani is primarily known for its focus on arts and social sciences, conducting research and academic services that nurture and develop fields such as language, culture, social science, humanities, and fine arts. March 13 is celebrated as PSU's founding day, honoring its legacy in the southern region and its role as a cornerstone of education and cultural development.

1. INTRODUCTION

The PSU Pattani Campus is pleased to continue hosting its Student Mobility Program for international students in 2024, following the successful launch of the initiative in the first semester of 2023. Aligned with PSU's vision to cultivate an international atmosphere on campus, this program supports our goal of fostering global citizenship among students.

The program primarily includes MOU partners from Southeast Asia, with over 30 universities invited to participate. Exchange students receive an academic transcript and certificate upon completion, though no degree is conferred by PSU. The primary participants are students from universities across Southeast Asia, and the program's key objectives are to create an international environment on campus and encourage multicultural living.

The program also aims to improve students, English language proficiency while offering them valuable insights into Thai culture. Participants have the opportunity to engage in activities that introduce them to Thai cuisine, tourism, fashion, and local customs, enriching their cross-cultural experience and promoting intercultural understanding.

2. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Student Mobility Program are as follows:

- 1. Fostering a Global Campus Atmosphere: The program offers students the opportunity to experience a new academic and cultural environment at a university in Thailand, enriching their perspectives and broadening their global outlook.
- 2. Providing a Multicultural Learning Environment: By participating in this exchange, students gain a deeper understanding of cultural diversity, allowing them to appreciate and navigate multicultural differences.
- 3. Enhancing English Language Proficiency: Interaction with international students provides local students valuable opportunities to improve their English, particularly in listening and speaking, through real-life conversations and cultural exchanges.

10. ACTIVITY

10.1 Pre-Departure Orientation

Prince of Songkla University hosted the Pre-Departure Orientation for the Student Mobility Program 2024 on June 10, 2024, from 11:00 am to 12:30 pm (Malaysia Time) via Zoom. The primary purpose of this event was to equip students with essential information for their upcoming exchange. The session was led by Asst. Prof. Dr. Warapark Maitreephun, Assistant President for Research and Social Mission at Pattani Campus, and featured key university representatives. The Head of the Registration Office provided guidance on course enrollment, the Student Affairs Officer highlighted university facilities and support services, and the International Affairs Officers presented an overview of the program and its objectives.



10.2 Pick-Up the Students and Dormitory Check-In

On August 6, 2024, participants in the Student Mobility Program arrived at the Sungai Kolok Border in Narathiwat, where PSU had arranged transportation to bring them to the university. The group consisted of 14 students from various faculties and campuses of Universiti Malaysia Kelantan. During the trip to the PSU Pattani campus, students took part in introductory activities and enjoyed some informal interactions to get acquainted. Upon arrival at the university, students checked into their accommodations immediately, female students in Dormitory 9 and male students in Dormitory 10.



10.3 Orientation

On August 13, 2023, Prince of Songkla University (PSU), Pattani Campus, hosted an orientation session for 14 students from Universiti Malaysia Kelantan (UMK), Malaysia, as part of the Students Mobility Programme. The event was graced by the presence of key university administrators, including the Vice President for Academic Affairs, Pattani Campus, Asst. Prof. Dr. Montira Leelakriangsak, Vice President for Student Development and Alumni Affairs, Pattani Campus, Asst. Prof. Dr. Bordin Waelateh, and Assistant President for Research and Social Mission, Asst. Prof. Dr. Warapark Maitreephun. Course instructors and professional staff also extended a warm welcome to the UMK students.



10.4 Narathiwat Trip

On September 14, 2024, students participated in an enriching field trip program in Narathiwat, where they explored a range of significant cultural and natural sites. The itinerary included the scenic Bajo Waterfall in Bacho, the historic 300-year-old Talokmanok Mosque, Ban Thon Beach, the Cultural Heritage Museum and Quran Learning Center, Ao Manao National Park, and the 100-year-old Yakang Community Floating Market. This program provided students with a unique opportunity to deepen their understanding of Narathiwat⁻s cultural heritage, natural beauty, and community values. Engaging with historical landmarks and community hubs allowed students to gain firsthand experience of the region s history and traditions, fostering a stronger sense of cultural appreciation, community awareness, and environmental stewardship.



10.5 Songkhla and Hadyai Trip

From 30 September to 1 October 2024, students engaged in an educational field trip to Songkhla and Hadyai. The program included visits to notable locations in Hadyai, such as the PSU President's Office, PSU History Hall, the PSU Hadyai canteen (Rong Chang), the PSU Souvenir Shop, Central Festival Hadyai, SeaVerse Cafe & Restaurant, and Kim Yong Market. In Songkhla, students explored historical and cultural sites, including Songkhla Old Town, the Golden Mermaid Statue, Songkhla Street Art, and Ban Na Korn Nai. Students stayed overnight at B2 Hotel in Hadyai City. This field trip offered students invaluable insights into the local culture, history, and economic activities of the region. The visits to PSU facilities and popular cultural sites enhanced their appreciation for both academic heritage and regional identity, fostering intercultural awareness, practical knowledge, and a sense of community.



10.6 Volunteer Works (Mini SEED Program)

On August 21, 2024, students participated in the PSU Mini SEED Program: Social Enterprise for Economic Development. This initiative focused on empowering students to make a positive impact through eco-tourism at Langkasuka Cape in Pattani Province. As part of this program, students volunteered to support sustainable tourism efforts aimed at promoting the natural and cultural heritage of Langkasuka Cape. They engaged in activities designed to highlight the area s unique environmental assets, raise community awareness of eco- friendly practices, and encourage responsible tourism. Through their efforts, students gained valuable experience in community service, learned about the principles of sustainable tourism, and contributed to the long-term economic and social development of the region. This hands-on experience also enhanced their skills in teamwork, leadership, and social responsibility, fostering a greater sense of commitment to sustainable growth in their communities.



10.7 PSU Night Run

On August 28, 2024, students participated in the "PSU Night Run" event at the Lamae Samilae multipurpose complex center at Prince of Songkla University's Pattani Campus. Organized by the Division of Student Development, PSU Pattani, this activity aimed to foster healthcare awareness, physical strength, and personal development among students, lecturers, and university personnel. By setting an example of a health-promoting institution, PSU emphasized the importance of wellness, encouraging participants to adopt healthier lifestyles. Held at night to create a unique and refreshing atmosphere, the PSU Night Run provided a chance for students to unwind from their studies while engaging in exercise. 10.10 Pattani Night Market and Walking Street

This excursion provided them with an opportunity to immerse themselves in the local culture, explore a wide variety of traditional foods, handicrafts, and unique goods that showcase the rich cultural heritage of the region. The lively atmosphere, with its array of colorful stalls and street performances, allowed students to experience Pattani's bustling community life firsthand. 10.11 Rusamilae Beach

Known for its unique charm, Rusamilae Beach is a popular spot among locals and students, offering breathtaking views of both sunrise and sunset. This makes it an ideal location to experience Pattani[,] s natural beauty throughout the day. The serene setting and stunning landscapes leave a lasting impression on visitors, enhancing their overall experience in the region. On this occasion, Asst. Prof. Dr. Warapark also joined the activity, adding a meaningful touch to the visit and fostering a sense of connection between faculty members and students as they explored the local sights together.



10.12 Farewell Party

10.13 Repatriate Students

They arrived at the border at approximately 11:30 a.m., where preparations were underway for a seamless crossing into Malaysia. By around 12:30 p.m., the students completed the border formalities and entered Malaysia. This transfer was meticulously coordinated with Universiti Malaysia Kelantan (UMK), which arranged to receive the students upon their arrival and facilitate their return to the respective UMK campuses. The collaboration underscored the strong ties between the two universities, fostering a supportive environment for the students and enabling a smooth cross-border journey as part of their exchange experience. This coordination not only ensured the students is afe return but also highlighted the commitment of both institutions to providing comprehensive support throughout their academic and cultural exchange journey.



11. Evaluation

The assessment was conducted with 14 students (11 females and 3 males) participating in the Student Mobility Program 2024. Based on the results of the Student Mobility Program Satisfaction Assessment, the following conclusions have been drawn:

This reflects an overall high level of satisfaction with the Student Mobility Program 2024.

Based on the Student Mobility Program Satisfaction Assessment conducted with 14 participants (11 females and 3 males) in 2024, the results reflect a high level of satisfaction across multiple aspects of the program. Here are some key conclusions drawn from the assessment:

- 1. Application Process: The application form received a high rating (Mean=4.71, SD=0.47), indicating that students found it straightforward and satisfactory.
- Cultural and Experience Exchange: The highest rating was given to the program³s effectiveness in facilitating cultural and experience exchange (Mean=4.93, SD=0.27), demonstrating the program's success in achieving this core objective.
- 3. Facilities and Support: Ratings indicate that students generally felt supported by PSU facilities (Mean=4.79, SD=0.43), found the instructors to be friendly and helpful (Mean=4.79, SD=0.43), and appreciated the services provided by program coordinators (Mean=4.79, SD=0.43).
- Accommodation: The PSU dormitory received a high satisfaction rating (Mean=4.93, SD=0.27), suggesting that students were pleased with their living arrangements.
- 5. Program Duration: The duration of the program received a relatively lower mean rating (Mean= 4. 50, SD= 0. 85), indicating a potential area for improvement, as students may feel adjustments could enhance the program's effectiveness.
- 6. Course Content: Participants generally found the course content suitable (Mean=4.71, SD=0.47), suggesting alignment between the program's offerings and the students' academic expectations.
- Recommendation and Expectations: The majority of students expressed a strong willingness to recommend the program to others (Mean= 4.86, SD=0.36), and most felt their personal expectations were met (Mean=4.86, SD=0.36), reinforcing the program's overall positive reception.

In summary, the assessment highlights a very positive response from participants, with high satisfaction in program structure, facilities, and cultural exchange opportunities. The program's duration could be revisited for potential enhancements, but overall, it effectively meets students' needs and expectations, making it highly recommendable
