11 February: Makha Bucha Day 13 February: Substitution of Makha Bucha Day

This month there is a public holiday, and that is *Macha Bucha Day*. This day is a Buddhist holiday, marking the occasion of the third lunar month, to honor Buddha and his teachings. In Thai, the third lunar month is known as "Makha", and "Bucha" means "to honor".

It is said that on the day of the full moon of the third lunar month, four special events occurred:

- 1. There were 1,250 Sangha followers that came to see the Buddha that evening without any schedule.
- All of them were "Arhantas', "Enlightened Ones", and all of them were ordained by the Buddha himself.
- The Buddha gave those Arhantas the principles of Buddhism, called "The Ovadhapatimokha". Those principles are: to cease from all evil, to do what is good, and to cleanse one's mind.
- 4. It was full moon on that day.

CHINESE NEW YEAR AND CHALONG TEMPLE FAIR

Chinese New Year is on the 28th of January. During the month of February every year, Chalong Temple, the most famous temple in Phuket, hosts a very fun and exciting fair to coincide with Chinese New Year. This year it will take place from 27 January - 2 February (usually open from 5pm until late). There is a great deal of food for sale, as well as clothing, bags, jewelry, flowers, and ceramics. There are also entertainment areas with darts and shooting games, ferris wheels, merry-go-rounds and playground areas. Many people will also pay religious respect at the temple during this festival.
