

### SATURDAY, JULY 8: ASARNHA BUCHA DAY

Also known as Dharma Day, this day celebrates the Buddha's first sermon where he shared the doctrine that he received following his enlightenment. This first sermon includes the teachings of the four noble truths: there is suffering, suffering is caused by craving, there is a state beyond suffering and craving; and finally, the way to nirvana is via the eightfold path. On this day Buddhists donate offerings to temples and listen to sermons.

#### SUNDAY, JULY 9: BUDDHIST LENT DAY

MONDAY, JULY 10: SUBSTITUTION FOR ASANHA BUCHA DAY

This public holiday is to commemorate the beginning of the rice growing season. The ceremony is of Hindu origin. In the ceremony, two sacred oxen plough a groove in ceremonial ground while Hindu priests (Brahmins) sow rice seeds. The oxen are then offered plates of food, including rice, corn, green beans, sesame, fresh-cut grass, water and rice whisky. Depending on what the oxen eat, court astrologers and Brahmins make a prediction on whether the coming growing season will be plentiful or not. The ceremony is held to guarantee a good harvest.

# 90 DAY REPORT ONLINE!

Must be done 8 - 15 days <u>BEFORE</u> the 90 day due date stamped in your passport.

On the IAC website (http://www.iac.phuket.psu.ac.th/) under "Useful Information" you can find a link titled "Online 90 Day Report Instructions" to guide you to do the online 90 day report. You can also contact IAC for further information and if you have any questions.

IMPORTANT: FULL-TIME INTERNATIONAL STAFF AND STUDENTS, PLEASE REMEMBER TO CHECK YOUR PASS-PORT TO SEE WHEN YOU MUST DO YOUR 90 DAY RE-PORT EITHER ONLINE (8-15 DAYS BEFORE DUE DATE) OR AT THE IMMIGRATION OFFICE IN PHUKET TOWN.
