4 February: Delegates from the ASK ASIA / ERASMUS MUNDUS Regional Workshop on "Agriculture, Skills, Knowledge in Asia: competences and employability of Erasmus Mundus Graduates in Agriculture on the Asian Professional Market"

Delegates from universities in countries including the Czech Republic, Belgium, Austria, France, Cambodia, Vietnam, Indonesia, China and Mongolia visited PSU Phuket campus. The delegates were traveling as part of the ASK ASIA / ERASMUS MUNDUS Regional Workshop, funded by the European Union (EU), as part of a worldwide mobility project. Dr. Olga Leuner, Researcher from Czech University of Life Sciences (CULS) in Prague, Czech Republic, introduced us to the ALFABET (Asia, Life, Food, Agriculture, Biology, Economics, Technology) Program. ALFABET is an international exchange program based around Life Sciences studies, offering 143 scholarships for students/ staff exchange, financially funded by the European Commission. There are 24 partner universities that prospective students could attend in Europe as well as Asia. The call for the next candidates will be from the end of October to the end of December 2015, with 50 scholarships still available. 6 February: Prof. Yasuko Shiozawa from Bunkyo University, Japan

We were delighted to have Prof. Yasuko Shiozawa, Head of the Department of International Understanding, Faculty of International Studies, Bunkyo University, Japan visit us for a day as Bunkyo University is interested in various further collaborations with PSU Phuket in both teacher and student exchanges, especially in the fields of Hospitality and Tourism.

17 February: Prof. Shimoda Tatehito and Prof. Kazuhiko Yamakawa from Reitaku University, Japan

On a Tuesday afternoon, we received visitors from Reitaku University (RU), also in Japan. Prof. Shimoda Tatehito, Dean of Faculty of Economics and Business Administration, and Prof. Kazuhiko Yamakawa, Faculty of Foreign Studies, Exchange Program Coordinator at RU spent a half day in meetings and touring PSU Phuket campus. The meeting with the Dean of FIS and FHT at PSU Phuket as well as program director of PICAS (Phuket International College of Arts and Science), and Assistant to the President for International Affairs, involved a long discussion on new opportunities to strengthen the current Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between RU and PSU Phuket, especially regarding student exchange. RU professors were intent on increasing the number of Japanese students from RU who come to study at PSU Phuket as well as Thai students to study at RU, where students would be able to take courses from various departments.

HOLIDAYS:

4 March: Makha Bucha Day

This month, we do have a public holiday, and that is *Macha Bucha Day*. This day is a Buddhist holiday, marking the occasion of the third lunar month, to honor Buddha and his teachings. In Thai, the third lunar month is known as "Makha", and "Bucha" means "to honor".

It is said that on the day of the full moon of the third lunar month, four special events occurred:

- 1. There were 1,250 Sangha followers that came to see the Buddha that evening without any schedule.
- 2. All of them were "Arhantas', "Enlightened Ones", and all of them were ordained by the Buddha himself.
- 3. The Buddha gave those Arhantas the principles of Buddhism, called "The Ovadhapatimokha". Those principles are: to cease from all evil, to do what is good, and to cleanse one's mind.
- 4. It was full moon on that day.
