RECENT EVENTS:

Thursday 23 October: King Chulalongkorn Memorial Day





This was the memorial day of the passing of King Chulalongkorn, also known as King Rama V. He was the son of King Mongkut and the grandfather of the current King of Thailand, His Majesty the King Bhumibol Adulyadej. King Chulalongkorn led several major peaceful reforms in Thailand, including within the Thai educational system, military affairs, state railway system and the slave liberation act. Several PSU Phuket staff members visited the Provincial Hall in Phuket Town where there is a statue of King Chulalongkorn to pay their respects.

27 October: Professor Hidehiko Motohama (Chair International Exchange Committee and Lecturer at the Faculty of International Studies, Bunkyo University, Japan) Visits PSU Phuket

The Professor's visit included a morning meeting to discuss further collaboration between PSU Phuket and Bunkyo University, Japan, with PSU Phuket representatives: Dr. Tatiyaporn Jarumaneerat (Assistant to the President for International Affairs), Assistant Professor Dr. Sontaya Anakasiri (Dean, FIS), Dr. Chantinee Boonchai (Assistant to the President for Organization and Collaboration Development) and Ajarn Kulsiri Chirayus (Associate Dean for International Affairs, FTE). PSU Phuket often hosts Japanese students from Bunkyo University on a yearly basis. A short PSU Phuket campus tour followed the meeting, where Prof. Hidehiko was shown some of PSU Phuket's new developments including ESSAND, AICAS, PSU Terminal and the newly built kitchen at FHT, after which lunch was served at Krua Nakarin Restaurant. Thursday 6 November: Loy Krathong Festival

Loy Krathong is a yearly festival held on the 12th lunar month. In the hours before sunset, you'll see many stalls selling 'krathongs' along the streets of Phuket. Made from the cellulose trunk of a banana tree, the purpose of the krathong is to put all your misfortunes in it and allow it to float away on the water ("Loy" meaning to float, and "krathong" meaning a leaf cup / bowl). Krathongs are carefully decorated with flowers and banana leaves, candles and 3 sticks of incense. After sunset, people take their krathongs to the nearest beach, lake, pond or river and release them. Some put nail clippings or strands of hair into the krathongs with the belief that the sins of the past year will be washed away; and some coins as a way of making merit.

You can enjoy the festival along any of Phuket's west coast beaches, while Nai Harn Lake and Patong Beach usually have the most activity. In Phuket Town you can visit Saphan Hin Park and Suan Luang (King Rama IX) Park, where many locals celebrate.





13 - 14 November: 3rd Annual PSU Phuket International Conference 2014

The key focus of this conference will be on Multidisciplinary Studies on Sustainable Development. The four major research areas include Environmental Technology and Management, Computer Science and Engineering, Hospitality and Tourism and Social Sciences and Humanities. Scholars, researchers, and graduates from various educational institutions from around the world have the opportunity to present their research and stimulate exchanges of knowledge and experience. There will be many nationalities represented and we have received 44 research papers in total.

We are also very lucky to have as our keynote speaker: Khunying Pornthip Rojanasunand, M.D. Director-General Central Institute of Forensic Science, Ministry of Justice, Thailand who will give the Keynote speech on "Forensic Science for Sustainable Development of Thai Society".

It is PSU Phuket's intent that the exchanges of knowledge during this conference will lead to mutual understanding and further research collaboration.
