APRIL 6: DELEGATES FROM THE NETHERLANDS EMBASSY TO THAILAND VISITED PSU PHUKET

On April 6th, 2022 H.E. Mr. Remco van Wijngaarden, the Netherlands Ambassador to Thailand, Mr. Seven Smulders, the Netherlands Honorary Consul for Phuket, Phang Nga, Krabi and Suratthani, visited PSU Phuket and the Faculty of Hospitality and Tourism (FHT). The distinguished delegates were warmly welcomed by Assoc. Prof. Prathana Kannaovakun, Ph.D., Vice President for Academic Affairs, Phuket Campus; and other representatives from Faculty of Hospitality and Tourism. During the visit, Asst. Prof. Pornpisanu Promsivapallop, Ph.D. delivered a brief presentation about the campus and the faculty, followed by a comprehensive research-based presentation on the economic impacts of COVID-19 in Phuket and Phuket tourism during pandemic presented by Asst. Prof. Chayanon Phucharoen, Ph.D. The delegates were impressed by the enlightening findings from the research and thanked PSU Phuket for our hospitality. And the day was concluded by a gift exchange and commemorative photo-taking.









APRIL 7: VIRTUAL MEETING BETWEEN YUNNAN AROUND ASIA INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION CENTER (YAAE), KUNMING, CHINA AND PRINCE OF SONGKLA UNIVERSITY, PHUKET CAMPUS

On April 7th, 2022 PSU Phuket hosted a virtual meeting with Yunnan Around Asia International Education Center (YAAE), Kunming, China. The virtual meeting was officially opened by Assoc. Prof. Pun Thongchumnum, Ph.D., Vice President for PSU Phuket Campus at the Teleconference Meeting Room, 3rd floor of the President's Office Building (Bldg. 7). During the meeting, Ms. Ma Chi, Director of YAAE, gave an overview introduction of YAAE. Whereas Asst. Prof. Pensiri Akkajit, Ph.D., Assistant President for International Affairs, Phuket Campus, delivered a brief presentation about the campus and the faculties. Both parties discussed about potential future collaboration focusing on recruiting Chinese students to continue their study both in undergraduate and graduate degrees at PSU Phuket.

The students were given a sticker as proof of passing the screening (negative test result), that must be shown before attending onsite classes.

COVID-19 UPDATE PHUKET & THAILAND

*Entry Measures into Thailand

(effective from 1 June 2022 onwards)


>>Foreign nationals

- Register on Thailand Pass
- Attach documents, as follows:
- Passport
- Certificate of vaccination or if unvaccinated / not fully vaccinated, RT-PCR / Professional ATK COVID-19 test result issued within 72 hours before departure
- Proof of Medical Treatments Coverage (minimum coverage 10,000 USD)
- Receive Thailand Pass QR Code within 1-2 hours
- Airlines and Disease Control Officers will check your documents









IMMIGRATION MATTERS

VISA EXTENSION

Students must apply for an extension of stay based on education at Phuket Immigration Office before the visa expiry date. Your permitted length of stay will be extended up to a maximum of one (1) year depending on your study period or only up to your passport expiry date if it expires in less than a year.

- Signed photocopies of:

- Last entry stamp

- One recent passport-size photograph (2 inches/4x6 cm)
- Application fee: 1,900 baht

Important:

You must notify IAC at least two weeks before your visa or extension of stay expires to apply for another extension of stay. You can apply for an extension of stay 45 days before the expiry date.

Overstaving is illegal!

Overstay fine is 500 baht per day with a maximum fine of 20,000 baht. If you overstay more than 90 days, you will be deported and

banned from re-entering Thailand. IAC shall not be held responsible or liable for any fees incurred due to your negligence.

90-DAY REPORTING

All international students are required to report themselves to the Immigration Office every 90 days.

The first 90-day reporting for new international students with new single-entry visa will be done automatically at the same time during the first visa extension at the Immigration Office.

However, students are responsible for filing their next 90-day

The 90-day reporting can be done by the following 2 ways:

In person

You can do the 90-day reporting 7 days before the due date to 7 days after the due date at Phuket Town Immigration Office at Room 101 or the drive-thru service. Please bring your passport with you.

You can use the online reporting only if you have reported yourself in person at the Immigration Office at least once before. You can report yourself online from 15 days before the due date to the actual due date.

WARNING: Fine for late reporting is 2,000 baht or 5,000 baht if you get arrested. It is your own responsibility to report yourself to the Immigration Office. IAC shall not be held responsible or liable for any ees incurred due to your negligence

90 DAY REPORT ONLINE!

Must be done 15 days **BEFORE** the 90 day due date stamped in your passport.

IMPORTANT: Full-time International Staff and Students, please remember to check your passport to see when you must DO your <u>90 day report</u> EITHER ONLINE (15 days before due date) or at the Immigration Office in Phuket Town.
